Subject:- Grant of Yearly Permission to Saraswati Ayurveda Hospital and Medical College, VPO Gharuan, Chandigarh Ludhiana Highway, Mohali-140413, Punjab (Inst. ID-AYU0407) with an intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and 2nd Renewal of Permission for seat increase from 60 seats to 100 seats, under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26 -reg.

Sir/Madam,

- 1) To assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely **Saraswati Ayurveda Hospital and Medical College, VPO Gharuan, Chandigarh Ludhiana Highway, Mohali-140413, Punjab (Inst. ID-AYU0407)** inspection was conducted on **15.04.2025 and 16.04.2025 in hybrid mode** as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM to process **the yearly permission with an intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and 2nd Renewal of Permission for seat increase from 60 seats to 100 seats under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26.**
- 2) The visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of the enforced regulations namely the Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals Regulations, 2024", provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations there under and was placed in the **125th Board meeting of MARBISM held on 09.06.2025 and Board decided to seek clarification for the observed shortcomings/defects found in the Assessment report and same was communicated to you vide letter of even no. dated 16.06.2025. In response on the same you have submitted the clarification vide ref. no. SAHMC/2025/541 dated 18.06.2025.**
- 3) Accordingly, the submitted clarification and the assessment report was once again carefully examined in terms of concerned Acts & Regulations and provision under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations **thereunder, and after verification observation is as under:-**

In lieu of the above vacancies we have appointed Dr Pranav as Assistant Professor in the Department of Shalaky Tantra on 02 May 2025 (**Annexure 4**) and Dr Kapil Dev as Assistant Professor in the Department of Rachna Sharir on 13 June 2025 (**Annexure 5**).

Assistant Professor in the Department of Rachna Sharir on 13 June 2025, After verification relevant document is submitted and in the OTMS appointment request is pending with teacher but relevant document submitted, so may be considered

Considering Availability of total teaching staff for UG(BAMS) Course as per the part 1 submitted by the college is

2. Hospital staff: -

As per MSR 2016 college Non Teaching faculty of Dravyaguna and Rasa Shastra shall be working/designated as part time staff as Pharmacognosist and Analytical Chemist respectively (**Annexure 6**).

The same were entered in Form Part 1 in Non Teaching Staff namely **Arti Grover and Kiran Kumari** who have been verified by the visitors in Non Teaching (**Annexure 7**).

At the time of entering names in Part 1 "one Pan Card Number is allowed to be entered only one time". So after entering the names of these staff in Non teaching staff we were unable to enter their names in hospital staff because the error occurred saying Pan Card Holder already exists (**Annexure 8**).

So please consider the above clarification for our application.

Submission may be considered.

4) Further, a **letter vide. ref. no. SPHE/2025/308 dated 30.07.2025** was received from you requesting to allow to pay the second installment of Rs. 25 lakh out of remaining penalty amount of Rs 1 crore imposed for appointing physically absent but present only on-paper teacher in the Academic year 2024-25.

- 5) The submission made by the college during clarification and assessment report along with the aforementioned request letter was placed in the **138th Board meeting** of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) held on **01.08.2025** and Board concluded that the college is not fulfilling the notified & requisite criteria for issuance of permission as per the Concerned Acts and regulations but fulfilling the criteria in accordance with the Board's policy letter issued on **09.01.2025 & 20.01.2025**. Hence, the Board decided to issue yearly permission with an intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and 2nd Renewal of Permission for seat increase from 60 seats to 100 seats under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26 after remittance of the remaining monetary penalty amount of Rs 1 crore imposed for appointing physically absent but present only on-paper teacher in the Academic year 2024-25.
- 6) Accordingly, your request for remittance of Rs. 25 lakh as 2nd installment was accepted **on the condition that the college shall remit the balance amount of Rs. 50,00,000/- (Rupees Fifty Lakh only) on or before 31st December, 2025 or the final outcome of Court Order in case no. CWP-28092-2024, otherwise the permission for the Academic session 2026-27 and subsequent session shall be withheld and same was informed to you vide letter of even no. dated 06.08.2025.**
- 7) In response of the same, the board is in receipt of an email dated 06.08.2025 from you enclosing a letter vide ref no. **SPHE/2025/782 dated 06.08.2025** informing that you have paid the second installment amounting of **Rs. 25 Lakh on 06.08.2025 through NEFT vide Transaction ID. S53128753.**


"DECISION"

- 8) **Therefore, Yearly Permission is hereby granted to Saraswati Ayurveda Hospital and Medical College, VPO Gharuan, Chandigarh Ludhiana Highway, Mohali-140413, Punjab (Inst. ID-AYU0407) and as per the Policy letter dated 09.01.2025 & 20.01.2025 with an intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course in accordance with Regulation 54 (3) of MESAR UG Ayurveda 2024 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and 2nd Renewal of Permission for seat increase from 60 seats to 100 seats for the academic session 2025-26, under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 subject to the condition that aforementioned shortcomings shall be fulfilled along with the following conditions:-**
 - I. Minimum **15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course** shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2025-26 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.**
 - II. Determination of fee and all other charges in respect of 50% of seats in private Medical Institutions and deemed to be University should be as per the guidelines issued by NCISM vide ref no. BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16.09.2022. Fees of the remaining 50% of seats are to be fixed as per the guidelines of Fee Fixation/Regulatory Committee (FRC) of respective State/UT/Deemed to be University.
- 9) Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
- 10) Further, **as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020**, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then **in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.**
- 11) Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
- 12) Compliance of all the requirements of Aadhaar Enabled Biometric Attendance System as mentioned in the Implementation letters vide. ref. no. 3/2024/MARB/AEBAS & HMS. Dated 09.05.2024 & 06.09.2024 issued by the Board.
- 13) **The following requirements must be fulfilled and the compliance report must reach the Board by 31st December, 2025 to be considered for the issuance of permission for the academic session 2026-2027:-**
 - i) All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled.
 - ii) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024.
 - iii) All the requirements of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations-2022.

iv) The remaining shortcomings mentioned in Para no. 3 above, shall be fulfilled.

- 14) The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college within the timeline as mentioned above to the President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2026-27.
